



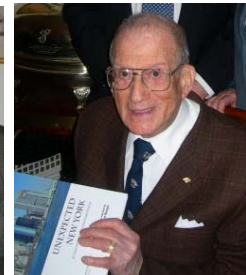
January Board Meeting Welcomes New Board Members

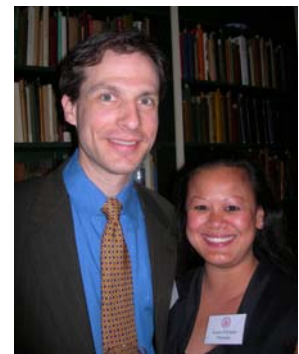
